

Indian Education Do you qualify?

IS THIS YOU?

You, your child (ren) or grandparents are enrolled as a member of an Alaska Native Group or American Indian Tribe.

For eligibility purposes, an Indian is defined as any individual who is:

- A member of an Indian tribe or band, including those terminated since 1940 and those recognized by the state in which the tribe or band resides
- A descendent in the first or second degree (parent or grandparent)
- Considered by the Secretary of Interior to be an Indian for any purpose
- A member of an organized Indian group that received a grant under the Indian Education Act of 1988 as it was in effect Oct. 19, 1994

To enroll, in the Title VI Indian Education Program, parents/ guardians must complete and return a Title VI 506 Eligibility Form to the MSBSD Federal Programs Office.
