OCS Special Needs Hotline

Services

The OCS Special Needs Hotline provides funding to purchase goods and services that are not included in the foster care reimbursement. Examples include emergency clothing, prescribed special food, emergency beds, summer camps, etc.

Each foster parent may request ONE-TIME funds for a foster child when there are no other resources for payment. Reimbursement will be made within 30 days of receiving a valid receipt.

- 2. If your child's school is unable to assist, contact GCI at 1-800-800-4800.
- 3. Provide an explanation as to why you were unable to receive services in the spring. (ex. Did not have custody of relative child, unaware of the resource, etc.)
- 4. Explain the financial impact COVID-19 had on your family.
- 5. Get internet access!
